Bradfield College's Outreach Programme and Mr Giles Bristow

Part of the remit when The Blackburn Science Centre was conceived was that, when built, the local community would have access to the Centre. The Science Department already work closely with the local primary schools and on 13 March it will open its doors once again for an evening of science and discussion led by Giles Bristow.

Mr Bristow is the CEO of the charity, Carbon Leapfrog. He is a qualified solicitor and an environmental law specialist. Giles' first degree was a BSc in Geography from Durham University, which he followed with a year of research into the geotechnical response of salt marsh sediments to sea-level rise. He attained his Masters degree in "Energy Policy and Sustainability" from the University of Exeter. His research thesis was on the impact of UK fiscal policies for renewable electricity generation on the project financing of renewable deployment.

Bringing together his legal background, knowledge of the energy system, markets and policy environment and general enthusiasm for the principles of Carbon Leapfrog, Giles manages and leads the London-based Carbon Leapfrog operation.

On 13 March, Mr Bristow will be leading the evening with a short presentation on "power to the people - how and why we should all engage with the generation of energy", followed by the opportunity for discussion and debate around this topic.

The evening is intended for anyone who has an interest in science, and enjoys being part of a group of individuals with a curiosity about the subject and/or science in general.
